The bus fare is \$10. You can register for your lunch when you register for a spot on one of the buses. See the event description on the calendar for instructions.

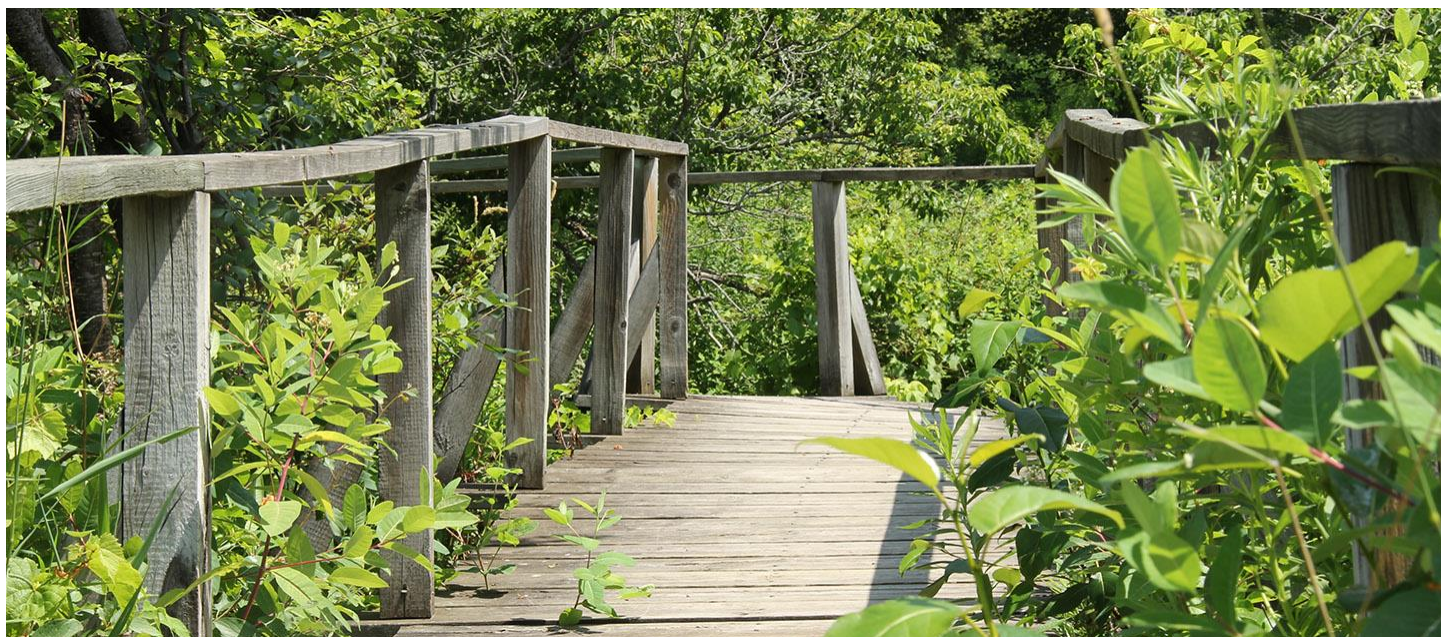
All buses will return to Toronto following the talk by the guest speaker.
